Childcare Services

Did you know that the University offers a range of childcare options for staff and students of the collegiate University?



Childcare Services has a small, friendly team at 92 Woodstock Road who are always happy to advise current and future parents about the available options.

We work with 13 early years establishments, all of which are located close to University departments and local hospitals. We provide competitively priced, flexible care for children between the ages of 3 months and 4 years. Parents can take advantage of our popular salary sacrifice scheme, and we also offer the government's 30 free hours' childcare for 3-5 year olds in all of our nurseries.

Childcare Services' nurseries are run by qualified professionals who are cognizant of the latest research on child development. All our nurseries are rated at least 'good' by Ofsted, with many achieving an 'outstanding' rating. Understandably, our nurseries are popular and we operate a waiting list system. Whilst we cannot guarantee every applicant a nursery place, at 1 place per 28 members of staff, the ratio of places available to parents at Oxford is significantly higher than any other HEI within the UK (in 2017, the sector average for the Russell group was 1:79).
